Mass Casualty Incident Full Scale Exercise – Draft Scenario Overview

The scenario is a complex, coordinated terrorist attack from an anti-government hate group. See event timeline and event descriptions below.

Breaking news injects will announce each event as it happens. The cadence for the messaging builds upon the following events¹. The first two events are very similar, but do not definitively link the attacks. It is not until a fictitious group, Cobalt Society², claims responsibility after the third attack, and pledges more violence until the collapse of society as we know it. After that, the attacks are all connected, and each clip connects it to the previous. In each clip, there will be a consistent message, including:

- **Location**
- **Attack description**
- **Number of injuries**
- **Type of injuries expected**
- **LE/EMS in process of responding to get more details**

The events described have all been derived from or based upon incidents and/or attacks that have taken place. Below, each incident and their corresponding real-life incident are listed:

While certain venues or settings may be inspired by real-world locations for realism, all names and identifying details have been changed. No affiliation with, endorsement by, or representation of any actual venue, business, or property is intended or implied.

² “Cobalt Society” is a fictitious name created solely for use in this training exercise. The name was developed by combining a periodic-table element (“Cobalt”) with the word “Society” which is synonymous with “people” or “group.” Open-source research identified no known organization associated with this name. Any resemblance to actual persons, groups, or organizations—living or dead—is purely coincidental, and no affiliation, endorsement, or representation is intended or implied.

TAMPA REGION — GULF COAST CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Cargo Aircraft Strike on FBI Tampa Headquarters

Venue: FBI Tampa

Event Date/Time: 08:00 (Local)

Exercise Time: +00

Capacity & Surge Planning (Tampa Bay Area): 12,403 acute care hospital beds

- **Surge 1 (10%):** 1240
- **Surge 2 (20%):** 2480

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **350** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Inhalation of mixed combustion products from jet fuel, structural fires, and burning lithium-ion EV batteries (including HF-like irritation and metal-rich particulates).
- Dermal and ocular exposure to battery electrolytes, industrial battery coolant, and aerosol cleaning agents released from cargo.
- Heavy soot and fine particulate contamination of skin, hair, and clothing from burning batteries, plastics, and building materials.

Key Features:

- Hijacked cargo aircraft deliberately crashes into FBI Tampa as part of a coordinated terrorist attack.
- Aircraft holds multiple pallets of high-density lithium-ion EV battery packs, associated electronics, and containers of industrial battery coolant and aerosol cleaning agents.
- Impact causes structural collapse, vehicle fires in parking areas, and multiple battery-related secondary explosions.
- Dense, metallic-smelling smoke plume drifts over the campus and nearby highways, prompting large numbers of contaminated or potentially contaminated walk-in patients at regional hospitals.
- All entities, facilities, and events are entirely fictional and used solely for exercise purposes.

“BREAKING NEWS” – TAMPA CARGO PLANE STRIKE

“BREAKING NEWS this morning out of Tampa, where officials say a cargo aircraft has crashed directly into the FBI’s Tampa headquarters. The impact occurred at approximately 8:00 a.m., sending fire and debris across the complex and surrounding roads.

Early estimates suggest **approximately 350** people may be injured, with hundreds suffering burns, blast trauma, or possible hazardous-material exposure from burning jet fuel and lithium-ion batteries which are believed to have been on board the plane. Thick, black smoke is visible from around the Tampa area.

Fire crews and law enforcement are still arriving on scene, working to fight multiple fires, reach people trapped in vehicles and offices, and establish a secure perimeter. At this hour, there is no clear indication of why the plane crashed, and authorities are urging the public to avoid the area and keep phone lines open for emergency use only.”

CENTRAL REGION — ORLANDO / LAKE NONA CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Cargo Aircraft Crash into Lake Nona Corridor

Venue: Lake Nona mixed residential/commercial corridor, including a high school campus, multi-building commercial centers, and surrounding neighborhoods under the final approach path to Orlando International Airport (MCO).

Event Date/Time: 08:02 (Local)

Exercise Time: +02

Capacity & Surge Planning (Orlando Area Hospitals): 4,113

- **Surge 1 (10%):** 411
- **Surge 2 (20%):** 822

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **984** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Inhalation of mixed combustion products from jet fuel, structural fires, and burning lithium-ion EV batteries (including HF-like respiratory and ocular irritation).
- Dermal and ocular exposure to soot, fine particulate matter, and battery-related residues.
- Possible secondary chemical exposures from damaged high school science labs (solvents, acids/bases) and commercial occupancies (cleaning agents, aerosols, pool chemicals).
- Dust and debris inhalation from collapsing structures (concrete, drywall, glass fibers).

Key Features:

- Aircraft cargo includes multiple pallets of high-density lithium-ion EV battery packs, associated electronics, and containers of industrial coolants and cleaning chemicals.
- Impact zone encompasses portions of an active high school campus, adjacent commercial buildings, and densely populated residential streets, with structural collapse.

- Multiple secondary explosions from EV battery cargo and vehicle fuel tanks intensify fires and generate a dense, drifting smoke plume over the surrounding neighborhoods.
- Large numbers of students, school staff, commuters, and residents self-evacuate and self-transport to area hospitals, many contaminated or potentially contaminated.
- All facilities, organizations, and events described in this scenario are entirely fictional and are used solely for exercise purposes.

“BREAKING NEWS” – SECOND MAJOR PLANE CRASH NEAR ORLANDO

“BREAKING NEWS again—just minutes after the Tampa crash, we are now learning of a second major aviation disaster in Central Florida. At approximately 8:02 a.m., a cargo plane on approach to Orlando International Airport has gone down in the Lake Nona corridor, slamming into a mixed residential and commercial area that includes a high school campus.

Officials are already warning of an estimated 1,000 injuries, including students, school staff, commuters, and nearby residents. Many are expected to be suffering from a combination of blast and burn trauma, smoke inhalation, and potential exposure to burning electric-vehicle batteries carried as cargo.

Law enforcement and fire units are still arriving on scene, working through heavy smoke, damaged buildings, and jammed roads. While this follows closely on the heels of the FBI Tampa crash, authorities say it is too early to confirm any link between the two incidents, but they are treating this as a rapidly evolving, mass-casualty emergency.”

BREVARD COUNTY REGION — PORT CANAVERAL CRUISE CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Small-Boat Explosion/Strike on Cruise Ship *Following Seas* (Fair Winds Cruise Lines)

Venue: Port Canaveral cruise terminal complex and adjacent berths; *Following Seas* moored port-side at passenger pier during final embarkation and pre-departure operations (ship at/near full passenger capacity with crew onboard).

Event Date/Time: 08:04 (Local)

Exercise Time: +04

Capacity & Surge Planning (Brevard / Port Canaveral Area Hospitals): 1,499

- Surge 1 (10%): 150
- Surge 2 (20%): 300

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **278** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Blast and fragmentation injuries (shrapnel-like wounds, tympanic membrane rupture, blunt trauma from pressure wave).
- Thermal burns (flash burns; secondary fires in adjacent compartments and along the pier interface).
- Crush and fall injuries (stampede-like dynamics during sudden evacuation; falls on gangways/stairs; mobility-limited passengers affected).
- Smoke inhalation and toxic combustion product exposure (respiratory distress and ocular irritation from burning synthetic materials; soot contamination of clothing/hair).
- Drowning/near-drowning and cold stress for individuals entering the water during the immediate aftermath.
- Dermal exposure to fuel residues, firefighting runoff, and soot/particulates (skin/eye irritation; contamination concerns complicating ED flow).

Key Features:

- A small vessel rapidly approaches the *Following Seas* while the ship is in port preparing to set sail on a 14-day voyage; the vessel strikes and detonates near the hull at/near the pier interface, producing a localized breach, intense blast effects,

and immediate chaos at the terminal and on board, where passengers have already boarded.

- Structural damage and rapid smoke spread occur in lower-deck spaces near the point of impact, prompting partial shipboard lockdowns, compartment isolation, and urgent evacuation of affected passenger areas.
- Simultaneous pier/terminal impacts: debris, shockwave injuries, and crowd surges affect the gangway area, screening lines, and terminal curbside pickup zones; some victims self-evacuate into the parking/road network.
- Mass self-transport and fragmented patient distribution to multiple facilities (private vehicles, rideshare, shuttle buses), with limited initial accountability for passenger manifests and crew rosters.
- Port access constraints: security perimeter expansion, berth closure, and traffic congestion delay coordinated EMS ingress/egress; staging is complicated by ongoing force-protection concerns and reports of a possible secondary threat (unverified).
- Complex family reunification and information management: distressed family members, media pressure, and inconsistent early casualty reporting drive high call volume and patient-tracking challenges across regional hospitals.

“BREAKING NEWS” – CRUISE SHIP IN PORT CANAVERAL STRUCK BY A BOAT CARRYING EXPLOSIVES

“BREAKING NEWS out of Port Canaveral this evening, where authorities say a fast-moving small boat has struck the Fair Winds Cruise Lines Vessel Following Seas while it was in port and preparing to set sail, triggering an explosion along the ship’s port side near the passenger pier. The impact occurred at approximately 8:04 a.m., during final embarkation with the ship believed to be near full capacity. We are receiving video that show a gaping hole in the side of the Following Seas.

Early estimates indicate up to 300 people may be injured, including passengers, crew, terminal staff, and bystanders on the pier. Dozens are expected to be in critical condition with blast trauma, penetrating injuries from debris, burns, and smoke inhalation. Witnesses report a heavy smoke plume near the gangway and chaotic scenes inside the terminal as families rushed to evacuate.

Fire-rescue and law-enforcement units are still arriving and establishing a secure perimeter on the waterfront, while crews work to suppress multiple fires and assess damage near the waterline. Officials are also warning of possible contamination from smoke, fuel residue, and soot—raising the likelihood that some self-transporting victims may arrive at area hospitals needing decontamination. At this hour, investigators have not confirmed the motive or whether additional threats are involved, but they are urging the public to avoid the port and keep roadways clear for responding units.”

THREAT ACTOR GROUP CLAIMS RESPONSIBILITY “COBALT SOCIETY”

Event Date/Time: 08:05 (Local)

Exercise Time: +05

“BREAKING NEWS” – VIDEO CLAIM OF RESPONSIBILITY BY “COBALT SOCIETY”

“We have more BREAKING NEWS. A short time ago, newsrooms and law-enforcement agencies received a video statement from a group calling itself ‘Cobalt Society.’ Authorities are working to verify its authenticity, but the message claims responsibility for the series of attacks this morning in Tampa, Orlando, and Port Canaveral.

In the video, a masked spokesperson speaks over distorted audio, declaring that ‘today marks the beginning of the collapse of a broken society’ and promising further attacks unless, quote, ‘the old order falls and a new one is reborn under our vision.’

Officials are condemning the message as terrorist propaganda and stressing that law enforcement at all levels is now operating under the assumption that this is a coordinated campaign of violence. Viewers are urged not to share the video online and to follow only official channels for updates.”

CENTRAL REGION — LAKE MARY / SEMINOLE SPORTS CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Cargo Aircraft Crash at Lake Mary Sports Complex

Venue: “Lake Mary Champions Park,” a multi-field youth baseball complex and tournament venue adjacent to major roadways near Lake Mary and Sanford International Airport.

Event Date/Time: 08:06 (Local)

Exercise Time: +06

Capacity & Surge Planning (Seminole County / Lake Mary Area Hospitals): 782

- Surge 1 (10%): 78
- Surge 2 (20%): 156

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **250** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Blunt trauma and penetrating injuries from aircraft debris, structural collapse (bleachers, light poles), and vehicle collisions in crowded parking areas.
- Inhalation of smoke and combustion products from jet fuel, structural fires, and burning lithium-ion EV batteries (including HF-like respiratory and ocular irritation).
- Dermal and ocular exposure to soot, fine particulate matter, jet fuel, and battery-related residues on skin, hair, uniforms, and clothing.
- Potential musculoskeletal injuries and heat stress.

Key Features:

- A cargo aircraft on approach to Sanford International Airport is deliberately crashed in the vicinity of Lake Mary Champions Park during a youth baseball tournament.
- Impact and secondary explosions affect active ballfields, spectator stands, and a congested parking area, igniting multiple vehicles and structural fires.
- Hundreds of children, parents, and staff self-evacuate in panic, leading to rapid self-transport of contaminated to area hospitals without EMS triage or decontamination.

- Roadway congestion near the complex and along major routes to hospitals complicates EMS access, organized transport, and coordinated use of decontamination resources.

“BREAKING NEWS” – CARGO PLANE CRASHES INTO LAKE MARY SPORTS COMPLEX

“BREAKING NEWS: Yet another devastating attack has been reported in Central Florida. Around 8:06 a.m., a cargo aircraft on approach to Sanford International Airport crashed into the area surrounding Lake Mary Champions Park, a large youth baseball complex active with players and families participating in a weeklong tournament.

Emergency managers fear approximately 300 people may be injured, including children, coaches, and spectators, with dozens of critical burn and trauma cases and widespread smoke and jet fuel exposure.

Law enforcement and EMS units are still arriving and staging around the complex, battling fires in parking lots and heavily damaged bleachers. In light of the video from the group calling itself ‘Cobalt Society’, investigators are treating this as part of a coordinated terrorist assault on Florida’s transportation and public-gathering sites.”

SOUTH CENTRAL REGION — KISSIMMEE / OSCEOLA EVENT CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Cargo Aircraft Crash at Osceola SpiritDome Events Complex

Venue: “Osceola SpiritDome Events Complex,” a large indoor arena and expo center hosting a youth cheerleading championships near Kissimmee and Kissimmee Gateway Airport.

Event Date/Time: 08:08 (Local)

Exercise Time: +08

Capacity & Surge Planning (Osceola County / Kissimmee Area Hospitals): 1,134

- Surge 1 (10%): 113
- Surge 2 (20%): 226

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **351** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Blunt and penetrating trauma from aircraft debris, collapsing interior structures (lighting trusses, speaker rigs, scoreboards), glass, and falling façade elements.
- Inhalation of smoke and combustion products from jet fuel, interior building fires, and burning lithium-ion EV batteries (including HF-like respiratory and ocular irritation).
- Dermal and ocular exposure to soot, fine particulate matter, jet fuel, and battery-related residues on skin, hair, uniforms, and spectator clothing.
- Possible secondary chemical exposures from nearby facility maintenance areas.

Key Features:

- A cargo aircraft on approach to Kissimmee Gateway Airport is deliberately crashed into the Osceola SpiritDome Events Complex during a youth cheerleading championship.
- Impact and secondary explosions damage interior competition floors, seating sections, and concourses, structural collapse, heavy smoke, and vehicle fires in the parking areas.

- Thousands self-evacuate simultaneously, leading to trampling injuries, separated children, and rapid self-transport of contaminated patients to neighboring hospitals.
- Severe congestion on surrounding arterial roads delays EMS access and organized transport, complicating regional decontamination planning and surge distribution across multiple receiving facilities.

“BREAKING NEWS” – MASS CASUALTY INCIDENT AT KISSIMMEE CHEER ARENA

“We continue our BREAKING NEWS coverage of what authorities now describe as an unfolding wave of coordinated attacks across Florida. At approximately 8:08 a.m., a cargo aircraft on approach to Kissimmee Gateway Airport crashed into the Osceola SpiritDome Events Complex, where a major youth cheerleading championship was underway.

Early estimates indicate roughly 400 people may be injured, including young athletes, families, and arena staff. Many are believed to have sustained blunt and penetrating trauma from collapsing structures and debris, along with serious smoke and jet fuel inhalation.

Law enforcement and fire crews are still pouring into the area, setting up triage zones outside the damaged arena. Investigators are urgently examining whether this latest crash, like the others, is tied to the extremist group calling itself ‘Cobalt Society,’ which earlier released a video claiming responsibility for the first series of attacks.”

COASTAL REGION — DAYTONA BEACH FESTIVAL CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Vehicle Ramming and EV Battery Explosion at Daytona Circuit Fest

Venue: “Daytona Circuit Fest,” a large-scale motorcycle and street festival in a dense coastal entertainment district with vendor rows, food stalls, and pedestrian-only concourses.

Event Date/Time: 08:10 (Local)

Exercise Time: +10

Capacity & Surge Planning (Coastal / Daytona Beach Area Hospitals): 1,436

- **Surge 1 (10%):** 144
- **Surge 2 (20%):** 288

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **181** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Inhalation of mixed combustion products from diesel fuel, food-vendor fires, structural materials, and ruptured lithium-ion EV battery packs.
- Dermal and ocular exposure to soot, oily residues, battery-related particulates, and chemical-smelling aerosol deposits on clothing, skin, and hair.
- Blunt and penetrating trauma with embedded debris, compounded by contamination of open wounds with particulates and surface residues.

Key Features:

- A full-sized electric pickup truck is deliberately accelerated through a pedestrian-only entrance at Daytona Circuit Fest during the opening peak crowd period.
- The vehicle plows through a tightly packed vendor concourse, striking large numbers of pedestrians before crashing into a diesel generator that powers a nearby stage.
- Impact and subsequent explosions from the generator and the truck’s lithium-ion battery pack create a fireball and a dense gray-white and black chemical-smelling aerosol cloud.

- Panic-driven crowd surge, trampling at choke points, and rapid self-evacuation generate additional traumatic injuries and large numbers of potentially contaminated walk-in patients at regional hospitals.

“BREAKING NEWS” – VEHICLE RAMMING AND EXPLOSION AT DAYTONA CIRCUIT FEST

“BREAKING NEWS from Daytona Beach, where authorities say an apparent vehicle-borne attack has struck the heart of the Daytona Circuit Fest motorcycle and street festival. At around 8:10 a.m., witnesses report a full-sized electric pickup truck accelerating at a high rate of speed through a pedestrian gate, plowing into dense crowds before slamming into a large generator and exploding.

Current planning figures suggest approximately 200 people may be injured, with dozens critically hurt by the initial impact, blast, and a subsequent fire involving the truck’s lithium-ion battery pack. A thick, chemical-smelling smoke cloud now hangs over the festival area.

Law enforcement and fire-rescue units are still arriving and trying to push into the crowded streets, as panicked festivalgoers flee in all directions. With multiple near-simultaneous attacks already claimed by ‘Cobalt Society,’ investigators believe this mass-casualty incident may be part of a coordinated campaign aimed at collapsing normal life across Florida.”

I-4 CORRIDOR — LAKELAND MEDICAL LOGISTICS DISTRICT

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Explosion at Lakeland MedEquip Logistics Hub

Venue: “Lakeland MedEquip Logistics Hub,” a fictional regional medical equipment and supplies distribution center in an industrial area near the I-4 corridor, serving multiple hospital systems across Central Florida.

Event Date/Time: 08:12 (Local)

Exercise Time: +12

Capacity & Surge Planning (Lakeland / Polk County Area Hospitals): 1,871

- **Surge 1 (10%):** 187
- **Surge 2 (20%):** 374

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **275** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Blast and shrapnel trauma from the storage tank explosion and secondary explosions.
- Inhalation of dense black smoke and mixed combustion products from burning packaging, plastics, and medical equipment housings.
- Possible inhalation and dermal exposure to sterilant and solvent vapors (e.g., ethylene oxide–like agents, isopropyl-alcohol-based disinfectants) from ruptured bulk containers.
- Exposure to oxidizing and pressurized gases involved in secondary detonations
- Dermal and ocular contact with spilled cleaning agents, disinfectants, and corrosive or irritant chemicals stored in bulk for facility sanitation.

Key Features:

- This attack causes a disruption of supplies to hospitals across the state as the initial explosion knocks out power to the entire facility.
- As part of a coordinated terrorist attack, an internal explosive device is placed on or near a large above-ground storage tank at the Lakeland MedEquip Logistics Hub, triggering a catastrophic tank failure at peak morning operations.

- The initial blast ruptures adjacent rows of compressed medical gas cylinders and bulk chemical/sterilant totes, producing multiple secondary explosions, fires, and chemical releases inside the warehouse and loading-dock areas.

“BREAKING NEWS” – EXPLOSION AT LAKE LAND MEDICAL SUPPLY HUB

“We have more BREAKING NEWS, this time out of Lakeland, where a powerful explosion has rocked the Lakeland MedEquip Logistics Hub, a regional medical-equipment and supply distribution center near the I-4 corridor. The blast occurred at about 8:12 a.m.

Early reports indicate around 300 people may be injured, including workers, truck drivers, and nearby motorists, with at least dozens suffering burns, blast trauma, or chemical exposure after a storage tank ruptured and triggered secondary explosions inside the facility.

Heavy black smoke is pouring from the complex, and the site’s power and internet connectivity are down. Officials have expressed that this attack is going to severely impact distribution of medical supplies to the locations in need across Central Florida. Given the series of attacks already claimed by ‘Cobalt Society,’ authorities now view this as a probable strike on the health-care supply chain itself, aimed at worsening the statewide medical crisis.

Law enforcement and hazmat teams are still arriving on scene, trying to identify what chemicals may be burning while also searching for survivors.”

LAKE COUNTY REGION — LEESBURG YOUTH SPORTS CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Cargo Aircraft Crash at Sunrise Ridge Park

Venue: “Sunrise Ridge All-Stars Park,” a multi-field youth soccer and baseball complex in Leesburg, adjacent to major arterial roadways and feeder routes serving Leesburg International Airport.

Event Date/Time: 08:14 (Local)

Exercise Time: +14

Capacity & Surge Planning (Lake County / Leesburg Area Hospitals): 823

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to result in approximately **233** patients presenting to, or being transported to, nearby hospitals.

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Blunt trauma and penetrating injuries from aircraft debris, collapsing light poles/scoreboards, bleacher failures, and multi-vehicle collisions.
- Inhalation of smoke and combustion products from jet fuel, structural fires, and burning lithium-ion EV batteries (including HF-like respiratory and ocular irritation).
- Dermal and ocular exposure to soot, fine particulate matter, jet fuel, and battery-related residues on skin, hair, uniforms, and spectator clothing.
- Musculoskeletal injuries and heat stress among evacuees and rescuers.

Key Features:

- A cargo aircraft on approach to Leesburg International Airport is crashed into the vicinity of Sunrise Ridge All-Stars Park during a large, multi-division youth sports tournament.
- Impact and secondary explosions affect playing fields, bleachers, concession areas, and a parking lot, igniting vehicle and structural fires and generating a dense smoke plume.
- Hundreds of panicked parents and spectators rapidly self-evacuate with injured children and relatives, and self-transporting contaminated patients to Lake County hospitals.

- Traffic congestion on surrounding two-lane roads and regional connectors significantly delays EMS access, organized transport, and the coordinated use of decon assets.

“BREAKING NEWS” – CARGO PLANE HITS LEESBURG YOUTH SPORTS PARK

“BREAKING NEWS continues from across Central Florida. At approximately 8:14 a.m., a cargo aircraft on approach to Leesburg International Airport has crashed in the vicinity of Sunrise Ridge All-Stars Park, a youth soccer and baseball complex crowded with players and families.

Officials are bracing for more than 200 injuries, including dozens of critical cases from blast trauma, burns, and smoke inhalation. Spectators describe scenes of chaos as bleachers collapsed, light poles fell, and vehicles caught fire in the parking lots.

Law enforcement and EMS are still arriving and attempting to push through gridlocked two-lane roads to reach the complex. In the context of multiple confirmed attacks and the claim of responsibility by ‘Cobalt Society,’ investigators say this appears to be another deliberate strike targeting children’s sporting events and the communities around them.”

TREASURE COAST REGION — AGRICULTURAL EXPO CORRIDOR

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Generator Explosion and Pesticide Release at Treasure Coast AgriTech Showcase

Venue: “Treasure Coast AgriTech Showcase,” a fictional large agricultural machinery and chemical expo complex outside Port St. Lucie, with indoor vendor pavilions, outdoor demonstration plots, and crowded exhibit aisles.

Event Date/Time: 08:16 (Local)

Exercise Time: +16

Capacity & Surge Planning (St. Lucie / Port St. Lucie Area Hospitals): 780

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Inhalation of pesticide or defoliant vapors from ruptured containers.
- Dermal and ocular contact with liquid pesticide, contaminated dust, and residues.
- Inhalation of dense smoke and mixed combustion products from burning booths, packaging, plastics, and generator fuel.

- Blast and shrapnel injuries from the generator tank failure and secondary explosions involving cylinders or fuel containers in nearby displays.

Key Features:

- An explosive device concealed on a diesel generator supplying power to the main pavilion at the Treasure Coast AgriTech Showcase, triggering a catastrophic fuel-tank explosion during peak morning attendance.
- The blast propagates into an adjacent agricultural chemical vendor area, rupturing multiple pesticide and defoliant sample containers and creating a drifting visible vapor/mist cloud through indoor aisles and out into outdoor demo zones.
- Attendees in the plume rapidly develop coughing, eye and throat burning, dizziness, and nausea, while blast-zone victims suffer penetrating trauma, burns, and shrapnel wounds.
- Individuals self-evacuate in private vehicles directly to St. Lucie County and neighboring hospitals without prior decontamination.
- All entities, facilities, and events described in this scenario are entirely fictional and are used solely for exercise purposes.

“BREAKING NEWS” – EXPLOSION AND CHEMICAL RELEASE AT ST. LUCIE AG EXPO

“We have received more tragic BREAKING NEWS coverage with yet another mass-casualty event, this time in St. Lucie County. At about 8:16 a.m., an explosion ripped through the Treasure Coast AgriTech Showcase, a large agricultural expo complex outside Port St. Lucie.

Officials estimate more than 400 people may be injured, including exhibitors, staff, and visitors. A generator explosion appears to have ignited nearby pesticide displays, releasing a visible chemical cloud along with heavy smoke from burning booths and equipment. Many victims are reporting coughing, burning eyes and skin, dizziness, and shrapnel wounds.

Law enforcement, fire, and hazmat teams are still arriving, racing to contain the chemical plume and move victims to decontamination and treatment areas. In light of today’s string of attacks and the earlier video from ‘Cobalt Society’, federal investigators say this incident fits the pattern of a coordinated effort to destabilize critical sectors and overwhelm Florida’s emergency-care system.”

- Dermal and ocular exposure to gaseous organophosphate (DIAZANON)

Key Features:

- Unmarked mosquito fogging trucks abandoned at key intersections throughout the region.
- Large clouds of grey colored “smoke” billowing from rear of the trucks.
- Individuals, presumed to be drivers, running away from the trucks.
- Winds are spreading the clouds across roadways and creating plumes that impact businesses, residences, schools and motor vehicles.
- Secondary to the fogging, MVAs are occurring in the vicinity as drivers try to avoid the visible clouds or succumb to severe coughing fits.
- Roadways are quickly locked down by responding LE.

- All facilities, organizations, and events described in this scenario are entirely fictional and are used solely for exercise purposes.

- Winds are spreading the clouds across directly over the events, impacting vendors and attendees.

- All facilities, organizations, and events described in this scenario are entirely fictional and are used solely for exercise purposes.

Incident Title: Coordinated Terror Attack – Hillsborough County Gun Show

Venue: FL State Fairgrounds

Estimated Impact (Planning Assumption):

- This scenario is expected to produce 425 patients presenting to area hospitals, FSEDs, and UCCs.
- 100+ Worried well (Potential/unconfirmed exposure).

Exposure Type (Likely Exposures):

- Ingestion of water containing organophosphate (DIAZANON)

Key Features:

- Two young males set up table with signage outside of the entrance to the Fairgrounds on April 8.
- Group provides free bottles of water as a way to patrons for them to speak about their cause. Approximately 400-500 received free bottled water from a vendor the previous day.
- 75 patients from throughout Hillsborough and surrounding counties show up to ED overnight complaining of similar symptoms.
- A water bottle was obtained and tested by State Laboratory confirming it contained an organophosphate.
- Individuals who ingested the water, but did not seek medical care overnight, will self-present to hospitals.
- All facilities, organizations, and events described in this scenario are entirely fictional and are used solely for exercise purposes.
