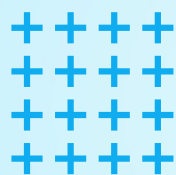

Introduction to the National Incident Management System and the National Response Framework. Explores the Hospital Incident Command System as a methodology for effectively applying the incident command system in a healthcare environment. The Hospital Incident Command System is discussed as it pertains to improving emergency management planning, response, and recovery capabilities for both planned and unplanned health and medical emergencies.

Mass Casualty Incident Response (HCV2)			
Provides mass casualty triage education and practical experience in the application of the SALT (Sort, Assess, Lifesaving Interventions, Treatment/Transport) Mass Casualty Triage Algorithm. The instruction addresses global sorting of mass casualties, assessment of individual patients, performance of on-scene lifesaving interventions and the treatment, stabilization, and transport of patients for further treatment in a healthcare facility.

Health Sector Emergency Preparedness: Planning, Response, and Recovery (HSEP-V)			
The purpose of the course is to prepare designated staff members from the seventeen healthcare providers and suppliers designated by the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services to plan, prepare, respond, and recover from disasters in their communities. The course addresses the intent and requirements of the 2016 Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services Final Rule. Conduct of a hazard vulnerability analysis, determination of detailed requirements for emergency operation plans and the conduct of incident action planning, emergency communication planning and stakeholder communication and messaging, planning and execution of emergency management training and exercises, and responding to and recovering from a disaster or emergency as an integrated member of a community health system. The course concludes with a culminating exercise that walks through the requirements and considerations for responding to and recovering from a disaster or emergency as an integrated member of a community health system.

Healthcare Facility Preparedness (HCV8)

Examines the requirements and considerations for preparing a community and associated healthcare facilities to capably respond and recover from a health or medical emergency. The instruction explores topics such as effective coordination, communication, and establishment of a common operating picture; understandings and agreements with relevant private sector, volunteer, and non-governmental organizations; caching and sharing of critical resources; planning considerations for addressing at-risk and special needs populations; and joint training and exercises to validate and improve community capabilities.

Planning, Response, and Management of Radiological and Nuclear Incidents (HMTV4)

An examination of the requirements, considerations, and tools for managing a radiological or nuclear event in a community. Addresses likely sources of a radiological or nuclear incident; Federal, State, and local response resources. The three phases of a radiological or nuclear response; elements of early phase response; radiological dosimetry calculations; a brief overview of Hotspot and the RadResponder Network; and intermediate and late phase response.

Medical Surge Management (HCV4)

Medical Surge Management examines the process for medical management of the immediate response phase of a mass trauma event. Explores considerations and challenges of establishing triage and life-saving interventions at the scene, transition of patients to healthcare facilities, and the prioritization and providing of emergency, life-saving treatment at a healthcare facility to do the best for the most patients.

Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD): We Need It More Than We Know (OLS-V2)

Discusses how stress kills people every day, including Police Officers, Firefighters, EMS, and hospital personnel. CISD helps reduce many types of stress by participating in either defusing/debriefing sessions or both following a tragic, traumatic, and sometimes gruesome emergency scene, response, or situation.
